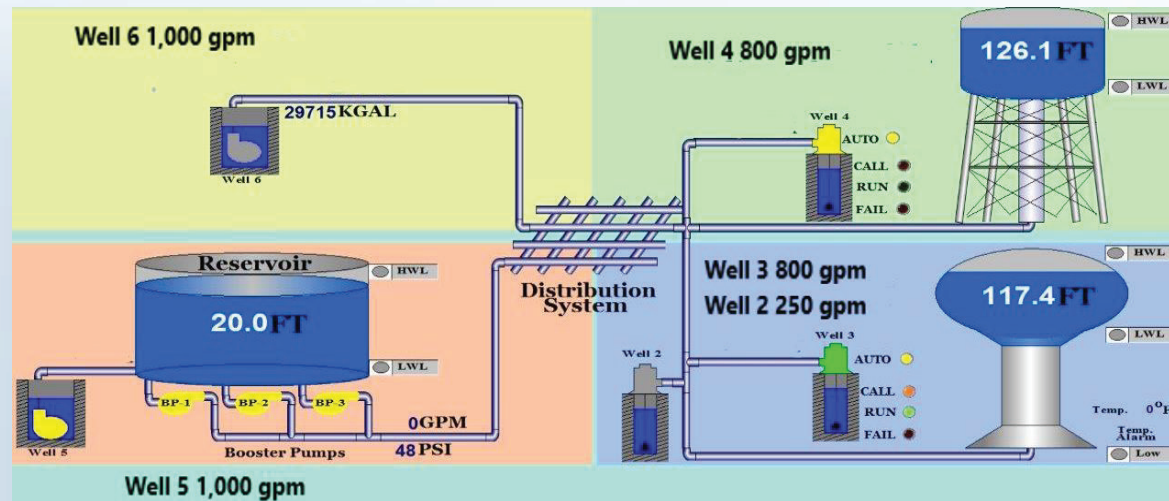


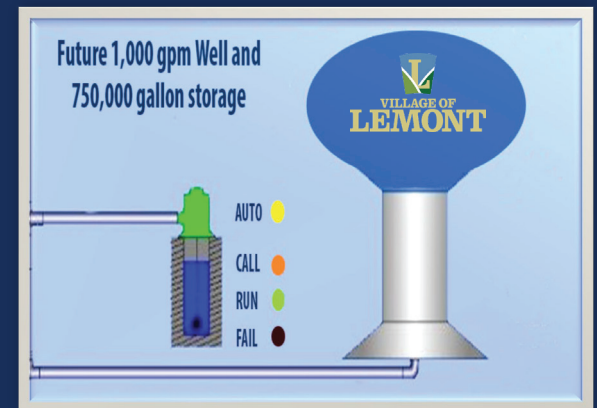

The Village of Lemont's Water Department takes pride in providing our community with safe, clean and reliable water. Our highly skilled and knowledgeable staff are on call to answer any concerns regarding water quality, water leaks, starting a new service, disconnecting an old service or any other questions one might have about the services we provide. The water quality in Lemont meets all the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) drinking water requirements and stands.

The Village of Lemont's water distribution system consists of approximately 98 miles of looped water main. Four deep water wells and one shallow emergency well provide an average of 2,500,000 gallons of water per day to Village residents. These wells have the ability to pump 4,250 gallons per minute or over 6,000,000 gallons per day. Two elevated storage tanks and one ground reservoir can store up to 1,600,000 gallons of water. The majority of our water comes from four of our deep wells that are 1,600 feet in depth. These deep wells reach the Aquifer water table which provides the highest quality of water with the least amount of water treatments. In looking to the future, one additional deep well is in the planning stages to accommodate Lemont's future growth.
